
## GRADE ONE LEARNER SUPPORT WORKBOOK

## Dear parents and quardians

This time is challenging to the learner, to you as the parent and everyone as it is unchartered territory for all of us. We wish to encourage you to keep your child stimulated with home lessons that are linked to the curriculum. Spend some quality time with your grade I child as this will encourage them to be more enthusiastic about the work and it also a bonding session for both of you. We are aware of the many ideas and programmes available on the media and internet. We do not want to confuse the learners with too much, as they too are confused with understanding the "Lockdown". We have made this simple with daily activities that you and your child can do at home. Make use of the home environment to reinforce understanding as well as the DBE workbooks at your disposal. If the learner has their DBE workbooks, they should work in them. Guide them and mark the work they do.


- There is a schedule for each day. You may complete the activities in any order beneficial to your child. Make sure you plan your time so that you do not let the work pile up at the end.
- Read each activity carefully before completion and check off the activities when completed. Tick the activity to show that you have gone through it with your child. Done:
- Foundation phase learners learn through play and they love to play games like "I spy, treasure hunt and school, school". So let's play with them.
- Consider that a grade I child has a short concentration span therefore each session will be about 10 15 minutes.
- Establish a daily routine to make the process easier and ensure that you talk about the pandemic, it is new and unsettling to them as well.
- Set out some time for story time where you tell a story(made up ones are the best!) and you read together to improve their reading skills.
- He/ She must draw and practise writing letters, words and sentences to stimulate their fine motor skills and improve their handwriting skills.
- Practice the phonic sounds and build words and sentences.
- This aims at reinforcing all the Language skills namely: Listening and Speaking, Reading and Phonics, Writing, and Language structure.

We share examples of activities grade I learners can do to keep them busy.

Read the -a- words. Circle the -a- sound in each word.


Read all the -i- words. Cross out all the -i- sound from each word.




